their house and moving so were kept very busy.


Joan & Fiona were not able to go away because


they have taken in a 'Rescue cat' which can't be

### A little bit of HISTORY / HERITAGE...below



**Neil ARMSTRONG** 

In 1972, NEIL ARMSTRONG, famed for his ... "one small step for man; one giant leap for mankind" visited the town of LANGHOLM in the Scottish borders.

This is where his ancestors came from.

A 400 year old decree by King James VI of Scotland, stated that all with the name **Armstrong** entering the town should be **hanged**.... ...This was because the Armstrongs were so notorious for their raiding and pillaging on both sides of the border in those days that he wanted them eradicated.

This ancient ruling has never been revoked...!

...but fortunately no action was taken; instead Neil Armstrong was awarded the Freedom of the Burgh.




