First Updates on Maisie

Messages from Ryan and Julie Maisie's son & daughter in law. 22/09/24:

Hi everyone, we have just left Maisie...(in Poole Hospital) She's off the ventilator & sedation. They've washed her hair, she looks so much better. I think she knew we were there as she was moving her head when we were talking. They had put 2 big 'boxing' gloves on her to stop her pulling her drips out, and then she was trying to pull her gloves off. So this felt like a step forward tonight.

Just waiting for her to wake up now, but we felt more positive tonight, than we have since Thursday. We've seen Maisie's fight shine through.

24.09.24 Note from Julie

We have been with Maisie today. She's still not conscious, but she was opening her eyes a bit more than yesterday. She is waiting to be moved to the neuro-rehabilitation ward ...but they are full at the moment, so she's still being looked after in critical care.

27.09.24 ... Note from Julie Maisie is sleeping most of the time but the doctors say they are amazed at the progress she has made and think it is a good sign. We do hope so.

02-10.24 ... from Paul

I've just been in touch with Julie. There's little change in our beloved Maisie, but it's good news that she's trying to say things, reaching out for her family, and that her brother has today arrived from Thailand to see her, which I'm sure will give her a great boost.

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05.10.24 from Julie There are ups and downs, but overall there's encouraging progress, Maisie is improving and recognising her family. The neuro-team are keeping a close watch on her and seeing her frequently. She is so much better than she was two

weeks ago.

10.10.24 from Julie Maisie is doing as well as can be expected. We've spoken to the doctor today and he has booked her in for an MRI to check her injury. She is responding to some commands, she opens her eyes and gives a thumbs up when asked, but anything more challenging is too hard

for her at the moment.

I know everyone is keen to visit but at the moment the doctor has requested family only due to it being too overstimulating for her, and she is just getting over an infection, so maybe another week and see how she is then.

<mark>26.10.24</mark> from Paul.... Maisie is now in the Neurological ward in Poole Hospital and getting the best treatment for her. Still no visitors

PS... from the editor I won't go on putting every update on Maisie here Her injuries are the kind that will take time to heal. We all are thinking about her and looking forward to the day she is able to come back to us.
