"Update wise, there isn't a lot to say unfortunately. It's a long road ahead. Maisie has days where she is calmer than others and there is the odd glimpse of her old self coming through, but the majority of the time she is in a confused state. . At this minute in time she isn't really engaging in therapies because she doesn't have the attention span to remain in an activity. She is still not able to eat... (by mouth), however she now has 3 sips of water per day and she has tasted some custard which she couldn't do a few weeks ago. Physically she is fit, but mentally she is not making very speedy progress. Some days she knows us, but other days she thinks we are other people. She is forever planning her escape and this can make her distressed. She just wants to go home with her family. She packs a bag and gets ready

to get the bus! The results from her MRI showed no sign of a stroke which is good.

The doctors just say we have to give her time. The only way for us to tell how she is doing is by what we see in front of us and compared to 10 weeks ago she's made amazing progress, we just have to wait and see where she gets to next. It's day by day. I wish I had something more solid to update everyone on.

We have another 'Team Meeting' on 12th, so we will know more about the future of Maisie then.
